

Start of operational participation of ELES and HOPS in IGCC

The International Grid Control Cooperation or “IGCC” was first established in 2011 to avoid the activation of counter-acting activation of aFRR balancing energy. The cooperation has grown and since 2016 counts with eleven TSOs performing the imbalance netting process in a coordinated manner through IGCC. These TSOs are: 50Hertz (DE), APG (AT), Amprion (DE), CEPS (CZ), Elia (BE), Energinet (DK), RTE (FR), Swissgrid (CH), TenneT (DE), TenneT (NL) and TransnetBW (DE).

IGCC is working towards meeting the requirements of the guideline on electricity balancing (EB GL) by facilitating the accession of the remaining continental European TSOs, to further increase efficiency and operational security in the European power system.

We are pleased to announce that a milestone towards the fulfilment of this goal is reached on 1st February 2019, with the start of operational participation of the TSOs from Croatia and Slovenia, HOPS and ELES, in IGCC. By this, the number of TSOs exchanging energy by using IGCC grows to thirteen TSOs. The Imbalance Netting Cooperation (INC), a cooperation on imbalance netting between APG (AT), ELES (SI) and HOPS (HR), comes to an end, being replaced by IGCC.
